





Relationships among Destination pages, belonging to different documents types



Pages of the Navigation layer

<u>Home page</u>	<p>→ Starting point of the navigation through the web site sections and related content/document types</p> <p>→ Space to highlight selected items</p>
<u>Portal page</u>	<p>→ Cover of a section subdivide in sub-sections</p> <p>→ Space to highlight selected items</p>
<u>Catalogue page</u>	<p>→ Section page listing a specific content/document type - Events, Projects, Publications etc.</p>
<u>Topic page</u>	<p>→ Page describing the Topic (Theme, Country, ILO Unit)</p> <p>→ Lists of content/document types classified by that topic</p> <p>→ Space to highlight selected items</p>

Pages of the Destination layer

Destination page

→ Page describing, displaying or downloading a content/document: Events, Projects, Publications etc.

Editorial page

→ Usually it contains a text for reading
→ It is accessible directly from the main navigation menu

Welcome to the International Labour Standards website!
ILO Conventions and Recommendations cover a broad range of subjects concerning work, employment, social security, social policy and related human rights.

The ILO supervisory bodies -- the Committee of Experts on the Application of Conventions and Recommendations and the Conference of Standards -- regularly examine the implementation of standards by member States. Representation and complaint procedures are initiated against states that fail to comply with their obligations. A special procedure -- the Committee on Freedom of Association -- reviews complaints concerning violations of freedom of association, whether or not a member State has ratified the relevant conventions.

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Rights at work



"The rules of the global economy should be aimed at improving the rights, livelihoods, security, and opportunities of people, families and communities around the world." - World Commission on the Social Dimension of Globalization, 2004.

Since its early days, the ILO has sought to define and guarantee labour rights and improve conditions for working people by building a system of international labour standards expressed in the form of Conventions, Recommendations and Codes of Practice. The ILO has since adopted more than 180 ILO Conventions and 190 Recommendations covering all aspects of the world of work.

Law was recently reviewed by the ILO that more than 70 of the Conventions adopted before 1985 remained fully up to date and the remainder required revision or withdrawal. In addition, dozens of Codes of Practice have been developed. In areas as varied as maternity leave and protection of migrants, these standards play an important role in the drawing up of national legislation.

A supervisory process helps to ensure that standards ratified by individual member States are applied and the ILO provides advice in the drafting of national labour laws. With the adoption of the *Declaration on Fundamental Principles and Rights at Work* in 1998, ILO member States decided to uphold a set of core labour standards regardless of whether they had ratified the relevant conventions. These are basic human rights and a central plank of decent work.

The Declaration covers four areas:

Freedom of Association

The right of workers and employers to form and join organizations of their choice is an integral part of a free and open society. It is a basic civil liberty that serves as a building block for social and
